



WASH THIS WAY!

WONDERING: How can I help others stay safe from viruses and germs?

You have learned how important it is to wash your hands the right way. But others may need to be reminded to wash their hands and protect themselves and others. You know better! So put on your teacher and artist hat to create a message to help your neighbors be safe. Whether they are walking their dog or getting food for dinner, your neighbors will thank you for the friendly reminder to wash their hands!

ACTIVITY

You have a choice. You can either create an indoor sign with pencils, crayons or markers OR an outdoor sign with sidewalk chalk.

Make sure that you have permission from a parent or guardian before you start your project! Ask them to help you find a good place for your message so that others can see it.

Decide what your words will be. You could write Wash Your Hands or something different. Then decide if you want to include pictures to support your words.

Create a rough draft on a piece of paper. A rough draft helps you practice different designs, plan your drawing and make sure you spell the words correctly! You can review this draft with an adult to get their feedback.

When you are happy with your draft, collect your materials and draw your message.

If you're creating an indoor sign, use paper, crayons and markers. When you are finished, ask your parent to help you put it somewhere so that others can see it.

If you're creating an outdoor sign, you can use sidewalk chalk if you have permission from your parents or guardians.

Do not use crayons or markers on anything other than paper since it can be hard to clean up afterwards.

When finished, don't forget to put away all of your materials!

MATERIALS

- Paper
- Pencil(s)
- Crayons/markers OR sidewalk chalk

EXTRA CREDIT!

Borrow or use your own phone to take a picture of your drawing and share it with your friends and family. Now your message can be seen not only by your neighbors, but by others who can't be close to you right now.
